AB 1300 Price	The Family Connection and Young Offender Rehabilitation Act of 2007.	02/26/2007-Read first time.	Would expand the purpose of the division to include the provision of comprehensive education to youthful offenders, in addition to training, treatment, and rehabilitative services, and it would provide that the services shall be designed to promote family ties, in addition to community restoration and accountability to victims, and to produce youth who become law-abiding and productive members of society. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.	MAJC

SB 914 Hollingsworth	Community care facilities: housing sex offenders: business licenses.	02/26/2007-Read first time.	Would allow a local jurisdiction that requires any type of business to obtain a business license to require that a community care facility obtain a business license if the facility houses any adult or juvenile sex offender who is under the supervision of the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, or whose use of the facility is required pursuant to a court order related to an offense committed by the adult or juvenile. By changing the definition of an existing crime, this bill would impose a state-mandated local program. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.	MAJC
