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4. Thank you for your help with this survey. Please provide any additional comments below.

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1	The sparse attendance at these meetings could be improved; so thank you for the survey. I think we need to ask counties (1) what they want from the meetings, and (2) break up small counties from large counties, and (3) break up by regions which might be the small/large county division. E.g., L.A., San Diego, Riverside meet, while the small Central counties meet (Calaveras, Amador, Tuolumne, El Dorado, Mariposa, Alpine, etc....) The Bay Area counties / Central Coastal counties might meet as a group. So, you would meet at 4 regions / size categories. It makes 4 or 5 meetings instead of 1, but when only 8 counties out of 58 attend, you really aren't serving their needs. Finally, the agenda needs to be revised to reflect the counties' needs, with more requests by the Chair for topics? Plus, sometimes outside groups attend that are not the ASOC supervisor or representative, and thus there is some confusion over the attendees. It would be great if all the ASOC supervisors would attend, but in order to get them there, we need to make the meetings more accessible and relevant to their needs. THANK YOU again for the survey!
