The overarching goal of the **STAY Process** is to support Transitional Age Youth (TAY) ages 16—25 years old in their steps toward enjoying a useful and productive life.

Objective:

Our process spans the entire range of life domains including community based mental health services, supported employment, education, transportation, housing, benefit acquisitions, health education, youth mentoring, etc. Using a collaborative approach with community resources, the **STAY Process** provides personalized and supportive services based on needs identified by each participant.

The **Housing Coordinator** helps participants find:

- ⇒ Emergency Housing
- ⇒ Transitional Housing
- ⇒ Specialty Housing (Board & Care, Room & Board, Sober Living Homes)
- ⇒ Low Income Housing
- ⇒ Apartment Life (Independent Living Skills, Rooms for Rent, Roommate Referrals, etc.)

The **Education & Employment Coordinator**

- ⇒ Group Support & Classes (retention skills , budgeting and much more)
- ⇒ Access to Computer Learning Lab
- ⇒ In-Program Support (tuition assistance, uniform/work attire fees, books, etc.)
- ⇒ Supported Employment
- ⇒ Resources and Referrals
- ⇒ Health Education
- ⇒ Group Discussions and Classes (employability, budgeting, cultural awareness)

The **Volunteer Coordinator** recruits and trains community members and college interns to serve as mentors. These citizens assist and provide our participants with:

- ⇒ New and rewarding social experiences
- ⇒ Guidance and encouragement to achieve their goals
- ⇒ Academic Support

Our **Staff Mental Health Therapists:**

- ⇒ Specialize in therapy for Transitional Age Youth (TAY)
- ⇒ Utilize short-term therapy
- ⇒ Are goal and life decision oriented
